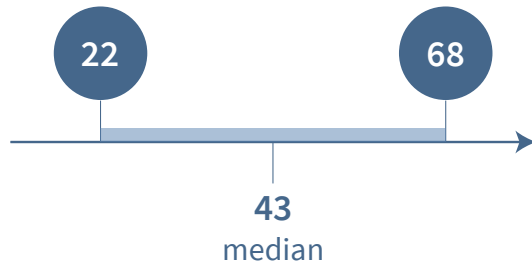


The SHAWNA Project includes 336+ women living with HIV who reside in or travel to Metro Vancouver to access HIV care services

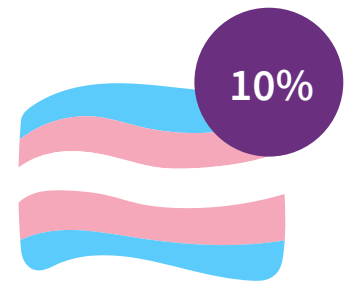

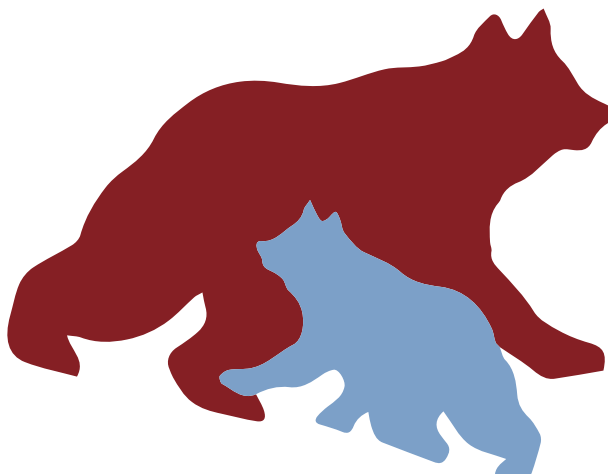
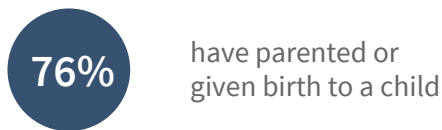
GENDER IDENTITY

Overall, 7.1% identified as trans women (including transgender, transsexual and other trans feminine identities) and 92.9% identified as cisgender women. Capturing gender fluidity over time, 9.8% of participants reported gender minority identity with 2% of the sample reporting gender diverse identity (non-binary, genderqueer) and 13% of Indigenous women identifying as Two-Spirit at some point in the study.

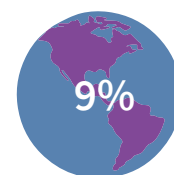

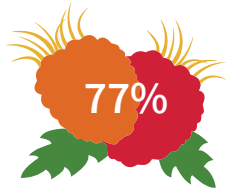

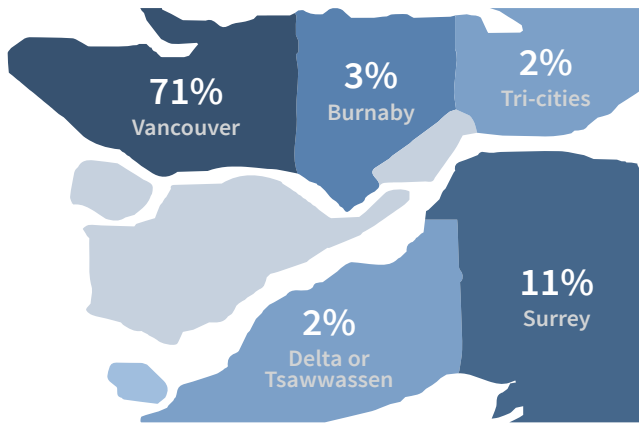

PLACE OF RESIDENCE



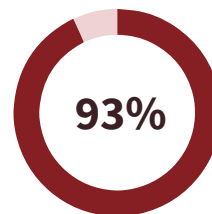
